

What is Community Owned Wind?

Community-owned wind is business that neighbors, landowners, local governments and local interests can own so that the benefits and control of power production are kept locally. It is typically on a far smaller scale than the large utility-scale wind farms.

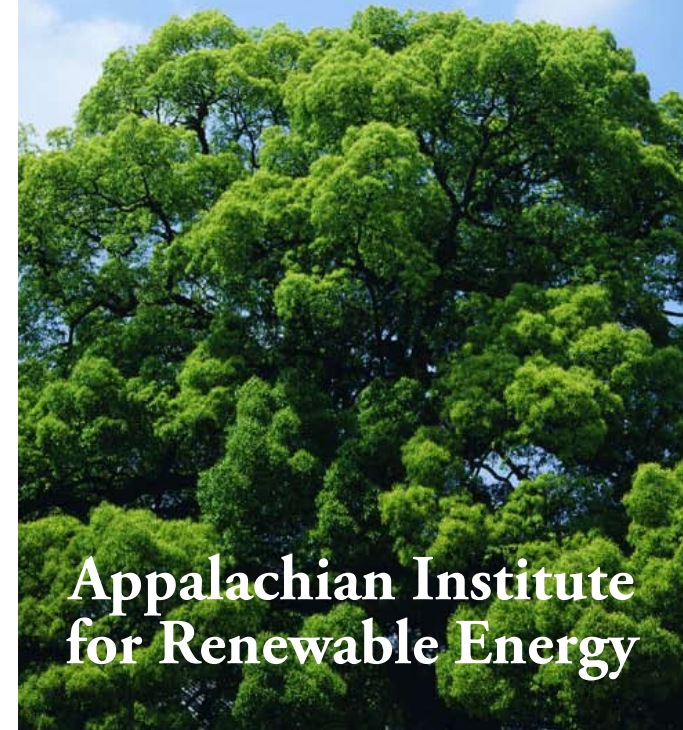
